From Pastor Chris...


So Christ has truly set us free. Now make sure that you stay freed, and don't get tied up again in slavery to the law. Galatians 5:1, NLT

The fourth of July holds special meaning for most Americans. We celebrate and remember July 4th because that is when we declared our independence. No more tea (only if you want it)! By signing the Declaration of Independence we were declaring our freedom from Great Britain. The 13 colonies that formed our country wanted to live under the laws that they established for our country, not the laws and taxes of another country that did not benefit us. Wouldn't it be ridiculous to start sending tax payments to Great Britain again?

In Galatians 5:1, the Apostle Paul is saying pretty much the same thing. Why would you want to go back and keep the old law when you have been set free from it? You have been liberated. No longer do you have to live the way you have been living, your free. Romans 8:2 reveals,...through Christ Jesus the law of the Spirit who gives life has set you free from the law of sin and death.

Unfortunately, all too often we live our Christian lives like we are not free. One of the reasons is that we still pay taxes to sin or we still allow sin to remain in our life, so we continue to be in bondage or slaves to sin. Paul tells us in Romans 8:12-13...[that we] have no obligation to do what [our] sinful nature urges [us] to do. For it [we] live by its dictates, [we] will die. But if through the power of the spirit [we] put to death the deeds of [our] sinful nature, [we] will live. There is a wonderful hymn that many of you are familiar with - Jesus Paid it All. From Christianity.com I found out that the words to the hymn were written by Elvina Hall in 1865, she was 45 at that time. One Sunday morning at Monument Street United Methodist Church of

Baltimore, during the pastor's prayer, she thought my "how long the Pastor's prayer this morning." "Elvina's mind turned to our need for salvation and the price Jesus paid for it" scibbling on her hymnbook the chorus and verses to the this hymn. After church, she gave it to the pastor. His face formed a little smile because earlier the music director had also handed



the pastor a new tune. The words and tune fit perfectly together for the hymn - Jesus Paid it All. Here is verse 3 of that hymn - Lord, now indeed I find. Thy pow'r, and Thine alone, Can change the *leper's spots (*leopard's). And melt the heart of stone. Verse 3 speaks of that wonderful freedom and change that can be found in Jesus Christ. CHRISTIAN SYMBOL JERUSALEM CROSS

This complex cross, also called the Crusader's Cross of Fivefold Cross, has several interpretations. The main cross if composed of four tau (T) crosses representing the Old Testament Law. The four small Greek crosses symbolize the fulfillment of the law in the gospel. The five crosses together represent the church's mission: to spread the gospel to the four corners of the earth. They're also said to symbolize Christ's five wounds (hands, feet, and side).
