

He did not have a kingly garment to wear, but simple clothes, nor was he placed in a crib fit for a King, but rather a feeding trough.

I don't think there is anything simpler than that first Christmas day, but the impact that day has had on humanity will continue until the end of the age.

The Christmas story amazes me because the living God chose to be born and to live among us and then to die for our sins. Have you ever asked God, why do you care so much? I have. I



know all the right answers because of God's great love for the world (John 3:16); but, my mind has trouble comprehending a love so deep, wide, vast, and long (Ephesians 3:18). But still, I cannot understand the depth of God's love for us. A love that never stops giving!

I will miss my usual Christmas, but really nothing has changed. We are celebrating the simplicity of that day 2,000 years ago when our Savior and Lord was born to set us free. With that in mind, the celebration of Christmas can never be shutdown, quarantined or masked! God's love just keep giving!
