

From Pastor Chris...

And now, go quickly and tell his disciples that he has risen from the dead, and he is going ahead of you to Galilee. Matthew 28:7, NLT

Have you ever received good news that you wanted to share with someone else? I think we all have. Perhaps, you received an acceptance letter to college, or you just found out you were pregnant or a son or daughter is expecting a baby, and now you will be a grandparent. Even though many exciting events happen in our life. the resurrection of Jesus surpasses them all. During our current Bible study, the book we are using is, Search for Significance. We looked at the Biblical truth of regeneration. Regeneration can be explained by a Scripture found in 2 Corinthians 5:17, NIV. Therefore, if anyone, is in Christ, the new creation has come: The old has gone, the new is here! We are made new by having God's Spirit given to us through regeneration. I've heard individuals say, "I need to get a new life." They use that phrase to perhaps mean, "I wish I were someone else." Through regeneration, we can get a new life. John Wesley, from his sermon, New Birth, explains regeneration this way,...it is the change wrought in the whole soul by the almighty Spirit of God when it is "created anew in Christ Jesus;" when it is "renewed after the image of God, in righteousness and true holiness;" when the love of the world is changed into the love of God; pride into humility; passion into meekness hatred, envy, malice, into a sincere, tender, disinterested love for all [humanity]. Wow! I never get tired of reading the same Scriptures over about the resurrection of Jesus because it renews and instills hope inside of me! But here is the question I often ask myself or have expressed to others, "why are people not beating the church doors down to get in?" Perhaps, one of the reasons is we don't share or teach on regeneration, or as the Christian

psychologist, who wrote the book *Search for Sig-nificance* said, "we don't feel different or see a difference in our own lives." Do you remember when microwave ovens first came out? The first time I cooked a potato in the microwave, it only took 6 minutes, but using a conventional oven was closer to an hour. Rarely do I bake potatoes in a conventional oven because I



don't want to wait, but one thing I have found to be true - is that the potatoes baked in a conventional oven are worth the wait. So it is true, in our Christian life, waiting on God to change us is so much better than trying to change ourselves. The Prophet Isaiah says this about waiting on God, ...those who trust in the Lord will find new strength. They will soar high on wings like eagles. They will run and not grow weary. They will walk and not faint (Isaiah 40:31, NLT).

He has Risen! What are the new things Christ will be adding to your life? What are some of the old habits that Christ is wanting to remove from your life?
